

June Visit 2017

MONDAY 29TH MAY

It's great to have the children back for what is our 10th visit in West Lothian group.

TUESDAY 30TH MAY

The children were reunited with their English teacher, Chris. Chris started with jogging the children's memory to see how much they could remember from previous years then taught them some new things. He sang them a song accompanied by his guitar then the children all sang Old Macdonald. They practiced their alphabet and were then handed out the letters amongst themselves. They then had to think of words beginning with those letters. They were very impressive! They played a game called Do You Like? They were split into two teams - the red car (answer no) and the blue car (answer yes) - and had to ask Chris questions starting with 'Do You Like...?'. Whichever team crossed the line first were the winners. Some of the questions were hilarious! 'do you like swimming with crocodiles?' or 'do you like pigs' to which Chris replied 'to eat or as a pet?'

After snack time, we headed off to the pool where the kids played with the toys and had great fun. Some of them have learned to swim since last year which was great to see. After lunch we headed off to the dance studio where work started on the farewell concert with dance teacher Joanne. The kids were amazing! We then headed back to the church hall to round off their day with some concert practice.























WEDNESDAY 31ST MAY

So, today, we had our visit to Bathgate Academy, which is always a day filled with fun for the children. The staff and pupils really made it special for us again this year. We headed straight to the pool for an hour or so of swimming and playing with the toys and floats. The pupils and teacher also joined in. The school provided a snack of crisps, a drink and a piece of fruit. Then it was on to some lessons in art and science. The children were divided into two groups. The science group did a few experiments involving glue and custard powder, which creates a bouncing ball and also some colour changing experiments involving the Bunsen burner!! The art class, meanwhile, had to lie down on a sheet of paper and be drawn round then the children had to colour their outline in. Then it was onto lunch and then presentation of the rucksacks to the children, which is always a highlight, as the children get very excited discovering the contents of their backpacks. After a big thank you to all involved making it another great day at Bathgate, it was back to the church hall for some concert preparation. As the children and interpreters had been inside all day, and the sun had been shining, Luda and Tania decided to take the children to the park to enjoy some early evening sun.























THURDAY 1ST JUNE

Day 4 of the Children's visit began with a visit to Specsavers in Livingston. The staff were excellent with the children testing their eyes and letting them choose glasses when they needed them. 8 children and 1 interpreter needed glasses this year. Specsavers then presented the children with a frisbee and a £10 voucher for toy shop 'the entertainer.'

We returned to the hall for lunch & concert practice then it was off to St John's Church in Bathgate for some games, including the Hokey Cokey! Whilst the children played, 4 at a time were taken to Bathgate Dental Spa where they all had a dental check. 2 had a tooth pulled out and many had fillings. They were all extremely brave even giving the dentists a cuddle on leaving! They were all given a gift bag with some dental health care items and a 'spinner' toy. Then it was back to the hall for a snack before going home. All in all a very productive day with some very brave children.

















FRIDAY 2ND JUNE

After revising numbers and letters, Chris introduced some new vocabulary – battleship, submarine, destroyer (which was initially puzzling and of limited use in a landlocked country). In the afternoon there was no relaxing as Luda and Tania took charge directing concert practice in the church hall. Everyone was totally exhausted by the time they headed home at the end of the day.


